## **Summary of Education and Professional Experience**

# Description of the Relationship of your Teaching, Research, and Service Activities

As an active member of Service Partnership Institute, I was paired with a community partner to collaborate in creating programs, applying for grants, and developing research. I was able to use my background in terms of experience and research to work with the Building Blocks for Kids (BB4K). I also use this opportunity to give my students exposure to working with real families. BB4K CEO, Dynette Clark came to my class (FSW 245 Child Development) in which the students interview families with a child

with disability to understand their struggles and apply what they have learned from the course. The students really appreciate the hands-on experience and making the learning to be more personal for them. The outcome of the assignment was used by the organization to update their website in order to broadcast the success stories of the families that were helped by the BB4K organization.

I am also currently planning on a program, "Promoting Resilient Single-Parent Families". The goal of this program is to help building a better community and providing support for single-parent families. This is part of my service to the local community individually by using Miami as a platform to improve the lives of single-parents in Butler county. This program will also include students to be actively participate in active learning as part of my teaching requirement. The students will have a first-hand opportunity to work with their community. I will also conduct a research to measure the effectiveness of the program and to test my hypotheses on what can be a protective factors for these single-parent families.
