As Chairperson of the Department of Teacher Education, I oversee all aspects of department functions, supervision, support accreditation (CAEP), and, with faculty, set the department's strategic vision rooted in the department mission, co-developed strategic plan, and threshold concepts. The average, yearly department budget (2017-2020) is \$7.3M accounting for operating, designated, restricted, grants, and expendable endowment funds. During this period of time there were on average 35 faculty (13 tenure-line and 14 full-time instructors [TCPL and VAP]; 8 part-time [per credit hour] faculty); 4 support staff (classified and unclassified).
