Are you a college student dealing with physical, learning, autism, sensory, or mental health concerns? If you are, you will want to check out a new partnership between Ohio's state college and university system, the Ohio Department of Higher Education, Ohio businesses, and Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD). Vocational Rehabilitation Counselors are in 15 public colleges and universities around Ohio to help students with job placement, technology, and internships. OOD has also expanded its business relations team to connect college students with disabilities to internship and permanent employment opportunities.

Here at Miami University, Wendy Taylor is the Ohio College2Careers Counselor. Three days per week, Wendy's office is in The Miller Center for Student Disability Services in Shriver 304 on the Oxford campus. She spends a day per week at both Miami Middletown and Miami Hamilton campuses while also traveling to Miami West Chester as needed.
